I, Jeff Davis, declare as follows:

- 1. I am a Captain at US Airways, Inc. (the "Company") and a member of the Negotiating Advisory Committee for defendant USAPA in this matter. I make this Declaration of my own free will and based on my personal, first-hand knowledge, unless otherwise specifically indicated.
- 2. On the afternoon of April 14, 2010, I attended a meeting of the Company's Board of Directors' Labor Committee at the Ritz Carlton in Phoenix, Arizona. The Committee invites the heads of US Airways' labor to attend its regularly scheduled quarterly meeting and I attended for USAPA's President, Mike Cleary, who was unavailable to attend.
- 3. After the meeting was completed, Bruce Lakefield, a member of the Company's Board of Directors' Labor Committee mentioned to me, in a conversation initiated by him, that the Company did not want to sell ten of its twenty-five E-190s (one of the Company's fleets) but that it did so to address the Company's cash crisis at the time and that the sale was one of many things the Company was doing to preserve cash. He told me, in so many words, that slowing the pace of contract negotiations with USAPA was another example.
